

## **Positions Description:**

**A.S. Senator:** The AS Senator is the liaison between the university wide Associated Students and the Sixth College Student Council. The AS Senator represents the needs of the University as well as the needs of the individual colleges. This position must sit on both SCSC and AS and complete two projects throughout the year to benefit students in his or her college.

**Commuter Senator:** The Senator is charged with working towards creating a community where Sixth College commuters are represented, valued and included. This position shall serve as the official liaison between Commuter students and the SCSC. The Senator co-chairs the Transfer and Commuter Student Coalition. The Senator also serves as the Sixth College representative on the All Campus Commuter Board. This is a voting member of the SCSC.

**Assistant Vice Chair of Records:** The AVCR is charged with keeping track of all Council documents and ensuring that they are readily available for members and Sixth College students. This member works closely with the VCI, VCE, Historian and Webmaster to ensure that all council activity is documented and publicized. He or she is responsible for taking detailed minutes of each SCSC meeting and coordinating their distribution and maintenance. The AVC must be available to take minutes at internal committee meetings when requested. This is a voting member of the SCSC. "This position requires you to be organized, dedicated, punctual, and a fast typer. And most of the time, there is nothing to report." – Lalida Sritanyaritana

**Assistant Vice Chair of Culture:** The AVCC is charged with empowering students, promoting acceptance and encouraging the appreciation of diversity. He or she chairs and coordinates the Culture Committee. The AVCC's primary function is event planning. This position facilitates different programs that expose, promote and integrate a diverse environment of cultures, including one small event in Fall quarter, CHAOS: Cultures Having An Outrageous Scene in Winter quarter, and the festival Kuncocshun in Spring quarter. The AVC works closely with other programmers and attends Programming Committee meetings. This is a voting member of the SCSC.

**Assistant Vice Chair of the Arts:** The AVCA is responsible for promoting art and integrating different styles and types of art into the daily lives of Sixth College students. He or she chairs and coordinates the Art Committee. The AVCA's primary function is event planning. This position facilitates different programs that foster artistic expression and introduce students to the art community, including one small event in Fall quarter, Spirit of the Masters in Winter quarter, and Kuncocshun in Spring quarter. The AVC works closely with other programmers and attends Programming Committee meetings. This is a voting member of the SCSC. "I feel like this is perfect training to be a kindergarten teacher. I learned exactly how to keep a bunch of people entertained for hours...just give them some paint!" –Caroline Crump

**Assistant Vice Chair of Technology:** The AVCT is responsible for both promoting and evaluating the use of technology at Sixth College; he or she is charged with ensuring that the SCSC stays on the cutting edge. He or she chairs and coordinates the Technology Committee. The AVCT's primary function is event planning. This position facilitates different programs that give Sixth College students an opportunity to enjoy and explore technology, including one small

event in Fall quarter, Winter Game Fest in Winter quarter, and Kuncocshun in Spring quarter. The AVC works closely with other programmers and attends Programming Committee meetings. This is a voting member of the SCSC.

**Assistant Vice Chair of Special Events:** The goal of the AVCSE is to facilitate social programs that enliven and enrich Sixth College Student Life. He or she chairs the Special Events Committee. The AVCSE's primary function is event planning. This position facilitates different programs that bring entertainment and fun to the student body, including one small event in Fall quarter, the annual Semi-Formal in Winter quarter, and Kuncocshun in Spring quarter. The AVC works closely with other programmers and attends Programming Committee meetings. This is a voting member of the SCSC. “This position requires dedication, talent, enthusiasm and a whole lot of hard work.” – Jenette Loveseth

**Assistant Vice Chair of Spirit:** The AVCS is charged with promoting Sixth College and UCSD spirit. He or she chairs the Spirit Committee. This position also co chairs the Spirit Night Committee along with an RA, as well as serves on the UCSD Spirit Night Committee. The AVCS's primary function is event planning. This position facilitates different programs that foster spirit, including one small event in Fall quarter, Spirit Night in Winter quarter, and Kuncocshun in Spring quarter. The AVC works closely with other programmers and attends Programming Committee meetings. This is a voting member of the SCSC. “In addition to pom-poms, thundersticks and cheers, this position requires a lot of positive energy and creativity. I’ve learned a lot about working with large groups of people and making things work in unexpected situations.” – Yoyo Chan

**Assistant Vice Chair of Marketing:** The AVCM is responsible for organizing the promotion of SCSC events. He or she chairs the Marketing Committee and attends Programming Committee meetings. The AVCM works closely with each programmer to determine their specific needs, then designs and implements a marketing plan for their event. The AVC continually works to utilize new ways to publicize events. This is a voting member of the SCSC. “Marketing is both a tough and rewarding position that requires a great deal of organization, determination, communication, and a little bit of creativity. People skills, effective use of your committee, and a cool head are key.” – Vishal Kotcherlakota

**Webmaster:** The Webmaster will be responsible for maintaining the SCSC website. The Webmaster will work with the Sixth College Chief Technology officer, VCE, AVC of Records, and AVC of Marketing to ensure that information accurately reflects the records and mission of SCSC. This is a non-voting position and an excellent opportunity for someone with website experience and lots of ideas to work with SCSC.

**Historian:** The Historian will work with the Vice Chair Internal to document Council and Sixth College events. This will be done through photography, video, or both. The historian will additionally work with the Commissioner of Records to create the SCSC scrapbook, which is in a yearbook-type format. This is a non-voting position and a good opportunity for someone with a lot of creative energy to get involved with the SCSC.

**Judicial Board Chair:** The Judicial Board is the body for 6th College that hears non-academic disputes involving students. The Judicial Board Chair is responsible for keeping the members updated and prepared and to set up times for hearings. The Chair will attend all hearings and possibly represent Sixth on the All Campus Judicial Board.

**Judicial Board Member:** Members will be responsible for attending all training sessions and preparing themselves to hear cases if and when they come up. All members will also be responsible for attending all hearings and possibly representing 6th college in all-campus judicial board cases. “Your college doesn’t need a judicial activist; it needs an active jurist.” –Shahin Saneinejad

***Committee Positions Available:*** *Representatives attend all of their committee meetings and serve as the voice of Sixth College students on the committee. They must attend the council meeting following their committee meeting and report on what happened or at least one meeting per calendar month.*

**Admit Day Committee Representative:** The Committee plans Sixth College’s component of UCSD’s Admit Day.

**Athletics, Recreation and Sports Facilities Advisory Board Representative (ARSFAB):** The Board serves as the principal advisory committee on athletic and recreation programs, sports facilities, and related policies at UCSD.

**Bookstore Advisory Committee Representative:** The Committee develops recommendations to help UCSD Bookstore management make operational improvements (determining and reviewing both short-range and long-range goals), and reviews general service and operational philosophy.

**Commencement Committee Representative:** The Committee plans Sixth College’s annual commencement exercises.

**Executive Committee Representative:** The Committee makes decisions that affect Sixth College, focusing on its academic program; the committee reports directly to the Provost.

**On Campus Residential and Dining Services Advisory Committee Representative (ORDS):** The Committee serves as an advisory committee, reviewing and recommending to the vice chancellor of Business Affairs on several facets of on-campus residence halls, undergraduate apartments, and dining services.

**Orientation Period Workgroup Representative:** The Workgroup plans all of the college’s new student orientation programs.

**Student Affirmative Action Committee Representative (SAAC):** This representative attends Student Affirmative Action Committee meetings. The Committee is a coalition of various organizations including Students with Disabilities, MECHA, APSA, Black Student Union,

Kaibigang Pilipino, Native American Student Alliance, and Queer People of Color. The SAAC representative acts as a liaison between Sixth College and the SAAC board. The SAAC representative reports relevant news, events, and initiatives between SAAC and Sixth College. The SAAC representative may opt to be involved in those activities at their discretion.

**Student Health Advisory Committee Representative (SHAC):** The Committee serves as a liaison between students and the Student Health Service and works to ensure that UCSD student's health needs are identified and met and their interests are represented in the development of health care policies and programs so that students will have access to high quality, efficient, and cost effective health care.

**Student Regulations and Review Committee Representative:** The Committee reviews campus student policies that have not yet been conformed to the most recently revised UC policies.

**Triton Tide Representative:** Triton Tide works to promote campus spirit and pride among the whole student body. This representative would work with Triton Tide and report back frequently to SCSC.

**University Centers Advisory Board Representative (UCAB):** The Board seeks to represent the needs and interests of the university community of UCSD students, faculty, staff and alumni when making decisions on how both the Price Center and Student Center can better serve this constituency.
